These spiders have eight legs.	<i>Photographs with labels are found in many nonfiction books. These labels tell us the parts of a spider. I wonder if this spider is a tarantula. What do you think?</i>	
Hairy spiders hunt bugs at night.	<i>In the third sentence, the author says spiders “turn their <u>prey</u> into juice.” “Prey” are animals that are hunted and eaten by other animals for food. Press Pause and highlight all the things spiders eat.</i>	
Hairy spiders do not hurt us.	<i>Wow! Someone in the photograph is holding a hairy spider!</i>
